<u>TAKING ROOT: The Vision of Wangari Maathai</u> WINS AWARDS AT PREMIERE FILM FESTIVALS

TAKING ROOT: The Vision of Wangari Maathai, a recent film by Lisa Merton and Alan Dater, has won fifteen awards since premiering at Full Frame Documentary Film Festival in Durham, North Carolina in April 2008.

The awards include the "Audience Award Winner" at Hot Docs, the largest documentary film festival in North America. Film festival audience members selected *Taking Root* from over 170 films shown at the April 2008 festival.

In August 2008, *Taking Root* was awarded the "Amnesty International Durban Hunan Rights Award" at the Durban International Film Festival in South Africa. [See full list below.]

Coral Vinsen, Amnesty International Durban executive member said in presenting the award, **"Taking Root: The Vision of Wangari Maathai"** stood out, for among other things, its demonstration of the transformative impact that the weakest members of even poor societies can sometimes have, using the limited means at their disposal in creative and committed ways."

Taking Root won the "Full Frame Women in Leadership Award" at the Full Frame Documentary Film Festival. Lisa Merton was awarded the "Nashville Women in Film & Television Award for Best Feature Length Film Directed or Co-Directed by a Woman" at the 39th Nashville Film Festival in Nashville, Tennessee. The film also received "Honorable Mention, Best Documentary Feature" at that festival.

Taking Root tells the inspiring story of the Green Belt Movement of Kenya and its unstoppable founder, Wangari Maathai, the first environmentalist and first African woman to win the Nobel Peace Prize (2004). The 80-minute film weaves a compelling and dramatic narrative of one woman's personal journey in the context of the turbulent political and environmental history of her country.

The film has been screened at over 40 festivals world wide and also aired on the PBS series *Independent Lens* in April 2009. It is now available for educational institutions, community organizations and home viewing. For more information on the film, visit takingrootfilm.com.
